What is ECTS?

ECTS, the European Credit Transfer System, was developed by the European Commission in order to provide common procedures to guarantee academic recognition of studies abroad. It provides a way of measuring and comparing learning achievements and transferring them from one institution to another.

The ECTS system is based on the principle of mutual trust and confidence between the participating Higher Education Institutions. Organizations participating in ECTS will describe the courses it offers, not only in terms of content, but also the allocation of credits to each module.

How are ECTS calculated?

ECTS credits are allocated to course units to describe the **student workload** required to complete them. They reflect the **quantity** of work each course requires **in relation to** the total quantity of work required to complete a full year of academic study at the institution that is, lectures, practical work, seminars, private work - in the library or at home - and examinations or other assessment activities. ECTS credits express a **relative value**.

It is up to the participating institutions to subdivide the credits for the different courses. Credits are awarded only when the course has been completed and all required examinations have been successfully taken.

ECTS and UK credit points

The University's Modular Framework is a system whereby the student is credited for the work completed throughout the year.
